

NURSERY QUILT BLOCKS

READ ALL INSTRUCTIONS CAREFULLY BEFORE STARTING WORK.
EMBROIDERY INSTRUCTIONS ON REVERSE SIDE OF THIS PAGE.

THE "ABCS" FOR MAKING YOUR CRIB QUILT

There are three ways that you can use your nursery quilt blocks. Always complete all embroidery and assemble blocks before laundering.

"A"—Use 24 blocks (2 pkgs. #1285) . . . approximate finished size: 36" x 50" which is a standard crib size.

1—Cut stamped design blocks out of material along stamped outlines; embroider each block individually.

2—Press embroidered block on wrong side.
3—Arrange designs in a pleasing manner.

4—Make 4 strips of blocks . . . each 6 blocks long; sew strips together. (SEE FIG. 1)

"B"—Use 12 blocks (1 pkg. #1285) . . . PLUS 12 blocks same size cut from plain colored cotton material to harmonize.

1—Same as "A"—1. 2—Same as "A"—2.

3—SEE FIG. 2 . . . arrange blocks alternating embroidered and plain blocks in a pleasing manner.

4-Same as "A"-4.

"C"—Use 24 blocks (2 pkgs. #1285) . . . PLUS strips of colored material as wide as you desire . . . this makes a larger size quilt.

1—Same as "A"—1. 2—Same as "A"—2.

3—Arrange blocks with material strips in a pleasing manner ... (See FIG. 3)

4-Sew together following (FIG. 3) for placement.

ASSEMBLING QUILT

 Press assembled quilt top on wrong side; press all seams flat for a smooth appearance.

Quilt backing is usually white material of the same quality as embroidered blocks. When using colored material blocks or strips, you may wish to use the same material for the backing. CUT BACKING PIECE SAME SIZE AS ASSEMBLED FRONT (QUILT TOP).

· Use cotton batting for filling . . . cut same size as quilt top.

 Lay back piece (wrong side up) on a smoth surface; place cotton batting on top of this. Place quilt top (right side up) over filling. SECURE THESE 3 LAYERS TOGETHER WITH PINS TO PREVENT SHIFT-ING.

 Starting at center, run basting stitches to each side and then diagonally to each corner.

· Baste around 4 edges of quilt . . . remove pins.

QUILTING . . . may be done in the hand or done with a quilting frame or hoop.

 Use a short sharp quilting needle and extra strong white cotton quilting thread . . . take small running or back stitches through all 3 layers of material.

 Do not knot thread . . . take a few tiny back stitches to secure it at beginning and end of work.

· To give your work an even appearance, always work from center to outside edges . . . quilt along seam lines.

 When seam lines are quilted, the embroidered blocks are to be quilted on dotted lines. Be sure each dot is covered with thread.

Plain colored material blocks may be quilted as you desire . . . we suggest marking the design on each block with a hard pencil before starting work.

BINDING

When quilting is complete bind your finished crib quilt with bias tape binding in the width and color of your choice.









EMBROIDERY INSTRUCTION CHART

Sufficient embroidery thread is provided in this package if you work carefully and neatly.

USE 2 STRANDS THREAD THROUGHOUT.



USE THE FOLLOWING COLOR KEY FOR ALL TURTLES AND FLOWERS

TURTLES

Dark Green - Outline and all markings on top shell except cross stitches. Outline and center line on under side of shell.

Head—Feet—Tail

Light Green = All cross stitches. All markings on under side of shell.

Brown = Eyes . . . we suggest solid stitch

FLOWERS

Pink = Petals Yellow = Centers Dark Green = Leaves and stems
