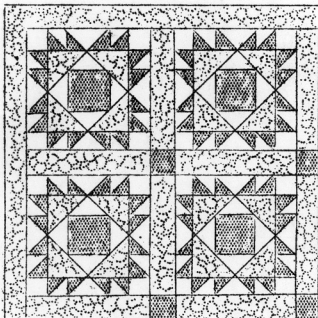


Corner Of Completed Quilt



SIZE OF QUILT-83x99-inches

This quilt is made up of thirty 13-inch pieced blocks arranged five in width and six in length put together with 3-inch plain strips and a 3-inch border. We suggest prints for the strips, but a plain color may be used.

COLORS

White, a print material and a solid color are suggested. See Color Chart for arrangement of colors. Print is used for the strips and border and solid color for the small squares between the blocks.

AMOUNT OF MATERIAL REQUIRED

Print.....5 yards
Solid Color...3 yards } Total--13 yards
White.....5 yards)

NUMBER OF PIECES TO CUT

Piece No.1..480 Solid
" No.1..240 white
" No.2..120 white
" No.3..240 white
" No.4..120 Print
" No.5.. 30 solid
49 strips, $3\frac{1}{2} \times 13\frac{1}{2}$ -print
20 squares $3\frac{1}{2} \times 3\frac{1}{2}$ -solid
2 strips $3\frac{1}{2} \times 83\frac{1}{2}$ -print
2 strips $3\frac{1}{2} \times 99\frac{1}{2}$ -print

QUILTING Quilt along all seams of the piecing. Use our quilting pattern No. Q43(2-inch width) on strips and border.

NOTE,CUT STRIPS FIRST TO GET FULL LENGTH WITHOUT PIECING.

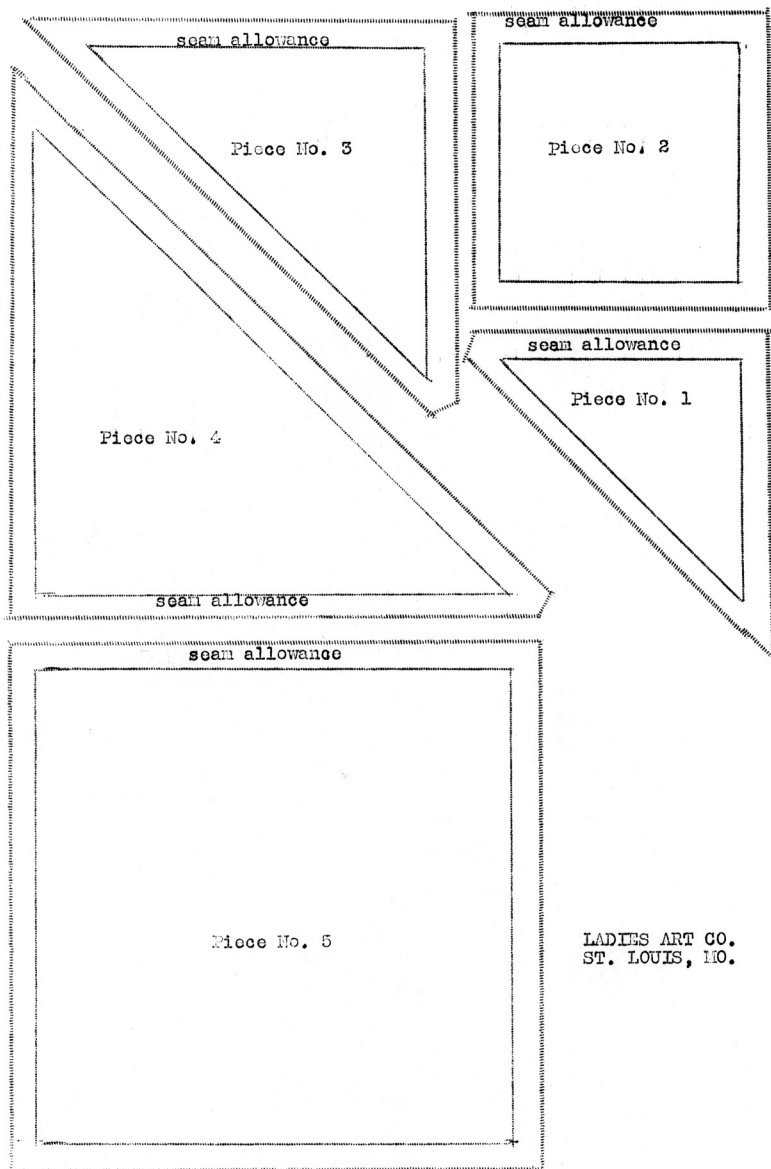

SUGGESTIONS FOR CUTTING

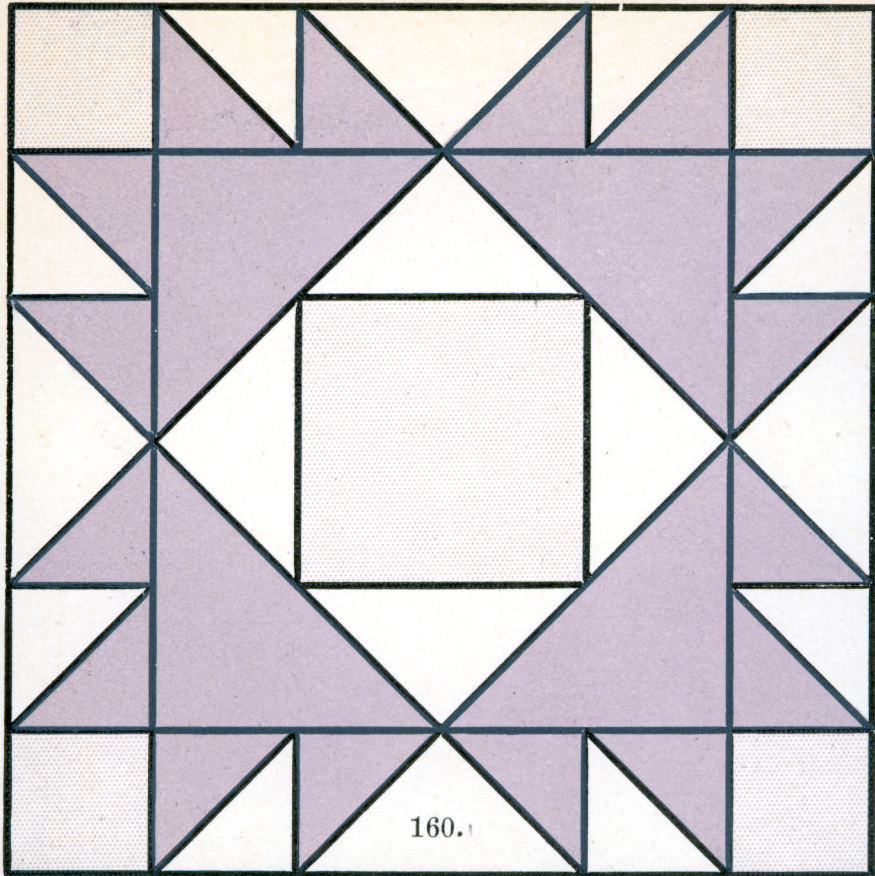
Trace pieces of the pattern on light cardboard or sandpaper and cut out. Use these cardboard or sandpaper patterns as cutting guides. The most accurate method is to lay the cardboard or sandpaper patterns on the material(rough side down if sandpaper is used); mark around with pencil and cut out on pencil lines. Be sure straight edges of the pattern is parallel with the threads of the material
