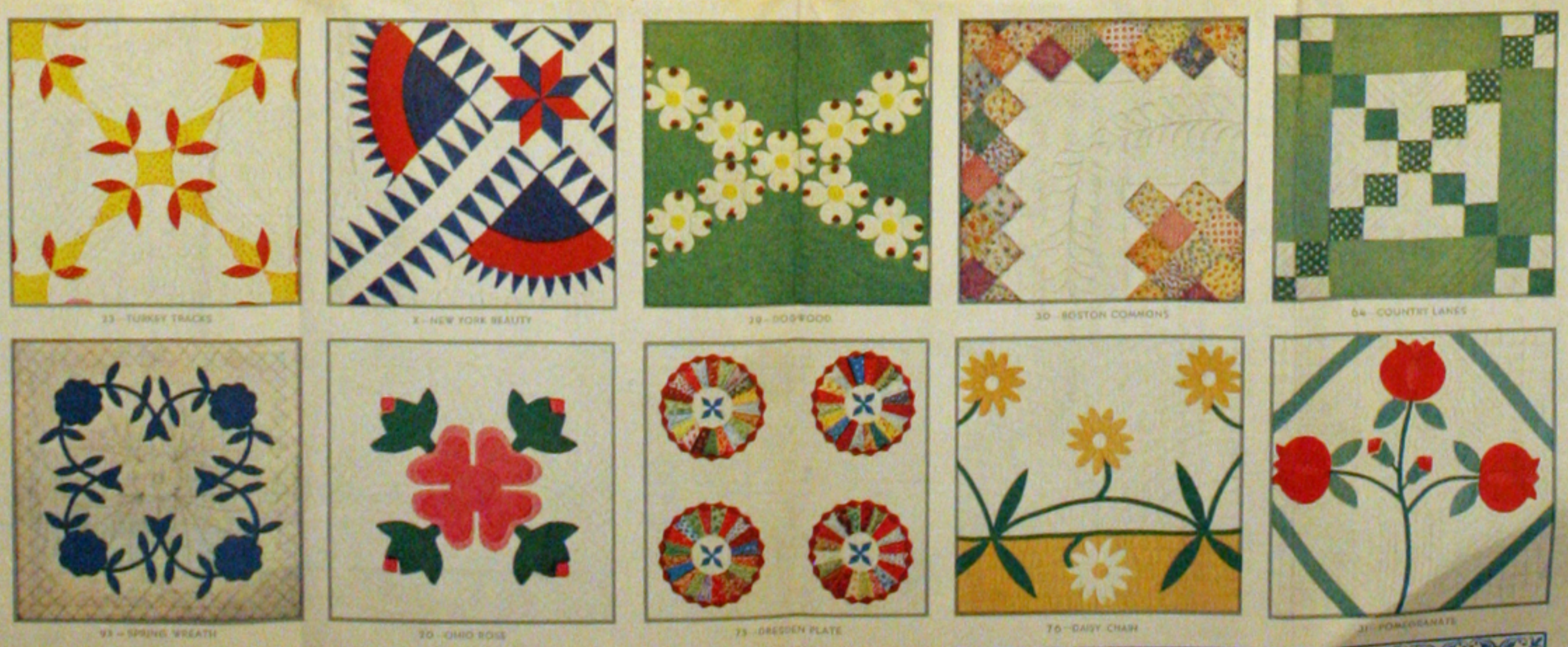

MOUNTAIN MIST PERFORATED QUILTING PATTERNS

Beginning with Pattern No. 30 of our Series, a quilting pattern will be perforated through the Mountain Mist wrapper. In cases where the perforated pattern is not suited to the design of the printed quilt pattern, it is intended that the pattern be saved for future use on another quilt.

DIRECTIONS FOR USING PERFORATED PATTERNS

To mark cloth with powder through a perforated pattern, place it on a firm surface such as a table top. You will notice the perforations are smooth on the side of the perforated pattern and somewhat rough on the side printed on fabric. Place smooth side of pattern next to the cloth and pin to hold it in proper position. For clear marking have as little movement as possible between pattern and cloth. If you wish a heavier marking, smooth the rough side of the pattern with sandpaper which will make the perforations a little larger.

MARKING POWDER. If you do not have marking powder you can mix it easily yourself. Turn any dry soap lye 7 1/2 oz. worth of Finewood Ultra-

marin (a blue powder) and mix 1 teaspoonful of it with 4 teaspoonfuls of ordinary powdered corn-starch. Or you may use powdered cinnamon or cocoa (avoid chocolate as it is greasy).

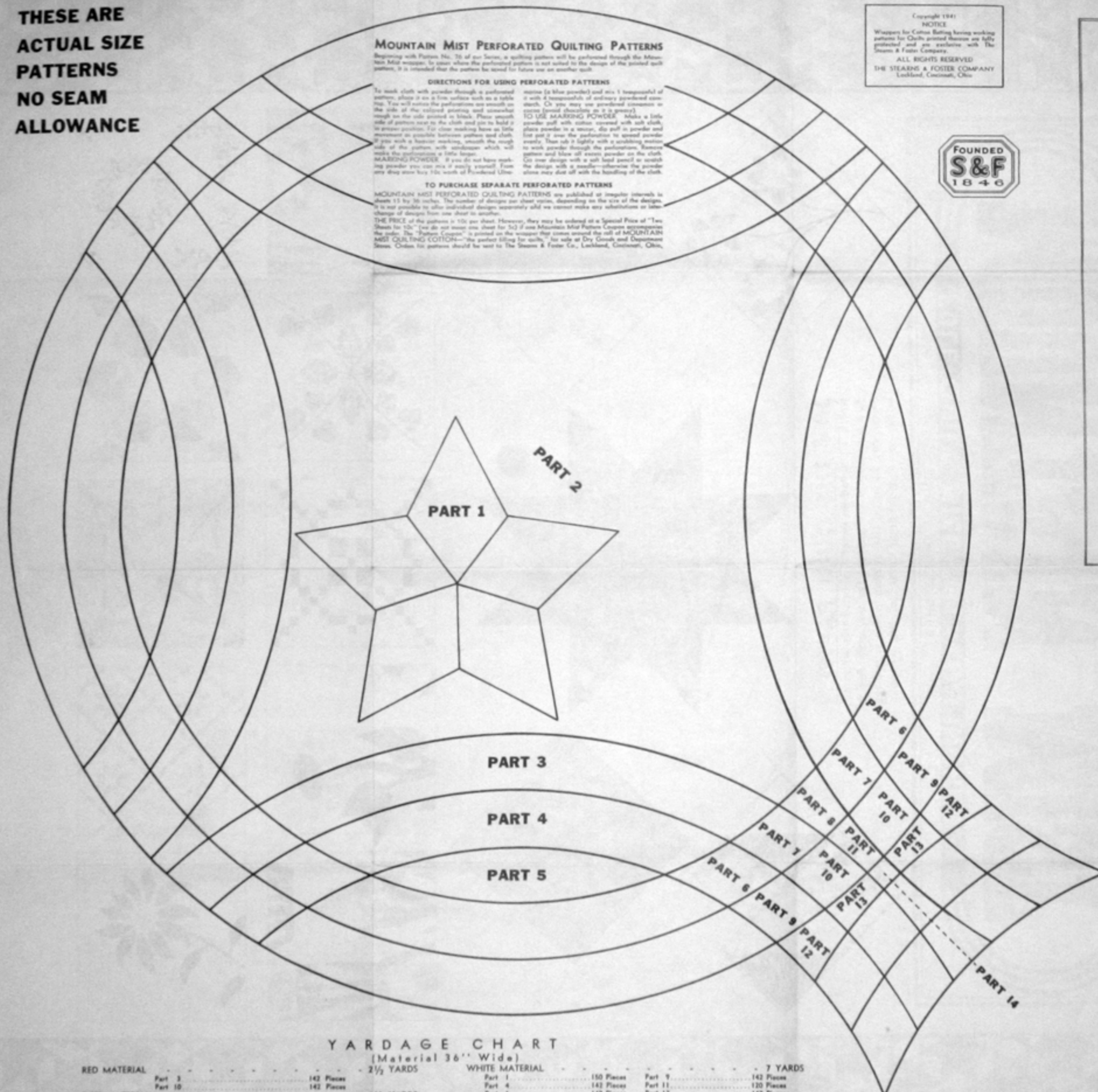
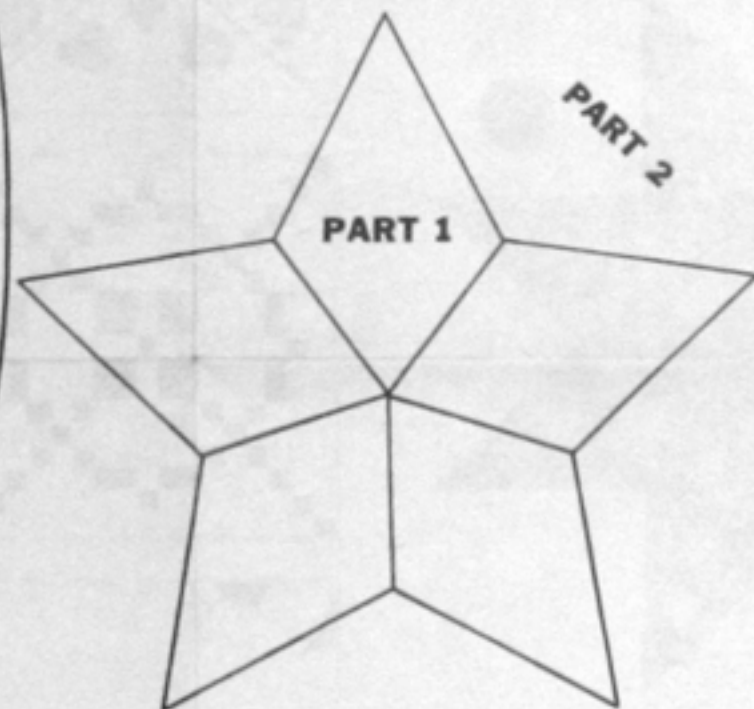
TO USE MARKING POWDER. Moisten a little powder with water covered with soft cloth, place powder in a saucer, dip puff in powder and tap it over the perforation to spread powder evenly. Then rub it lightly with a smoothing motion to work powder through the perforation. Remove pattern and blow off excess powder on the cloth. Cut one design with a soft lead pencil or scratch the design with a needle—otherwise the powder alone may dust off with the handling of the cloth.

TO PURCHASE SEPARATE PERFORATED PATTERNS

MOUNTAIN MIST PERFORATED QUILTING PATTERNS are published at irregular intervals in sheets 15 by 36 inches. The number of designs per sheet varies, depending on the size of the designs. It is not possible to alter individual designs separately and we cannot make any substitutions or interchange of designs from one sheet to another.

THE PRICE of the patterns is 10¢ per sheet. However, they may be ordered at a Special Price of "Two Sheets for 15¢" (we do not issue one sheet for 5¢) if one Mountain Mist Pattern Catalog accompanies the order. The "Pattern Catalog" is printed on the wrapper that comes around the roll of MOUNTAIN MIST QUILTING COTTON—the perfect filling for quilts—for sale at Dry Goods and Department Stores. 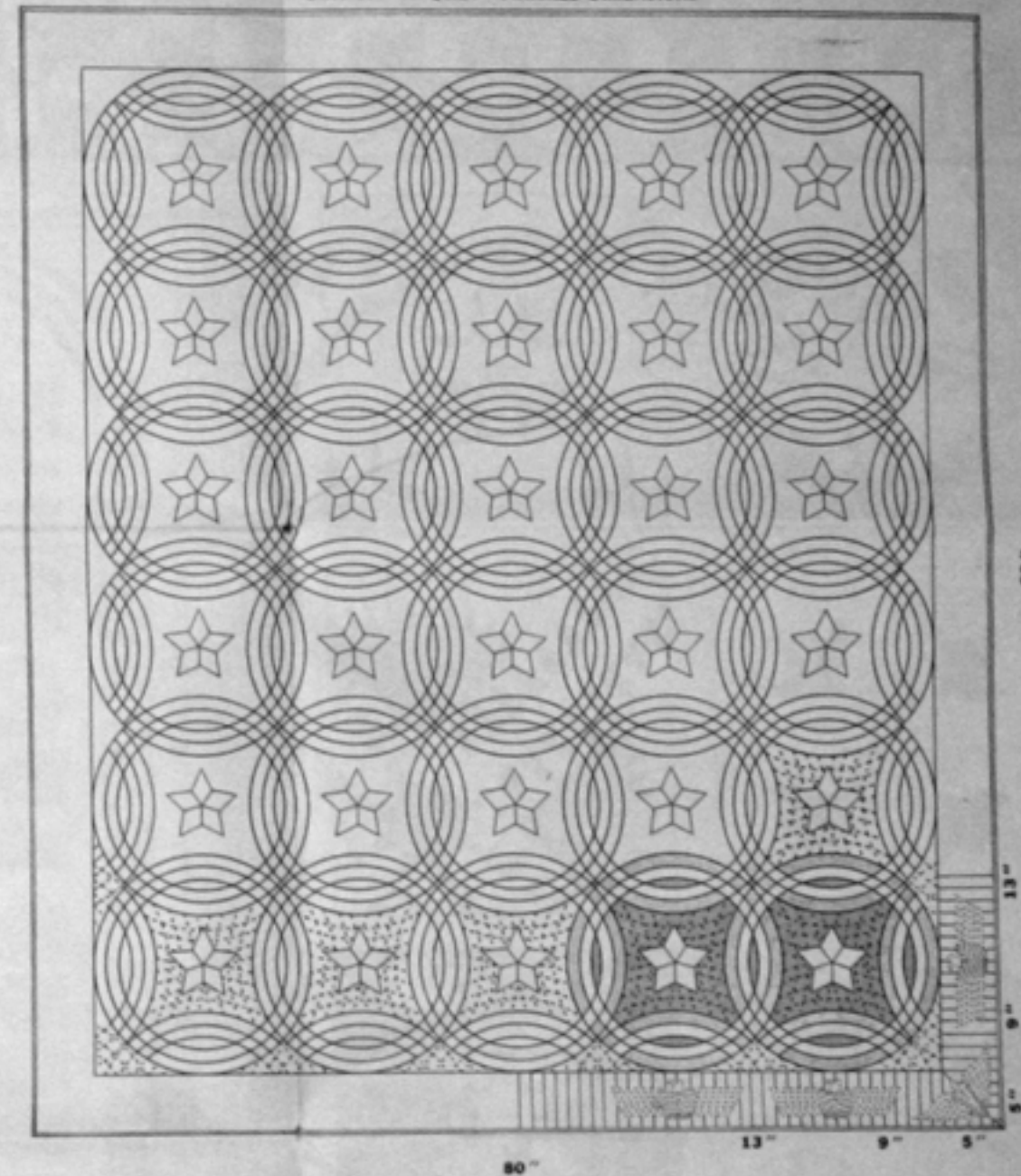

Patriot's Pride

Pattern No. 84 of the Mountain Mist Series
A PIECED AND APPLIQUED QUILT

All true Americans love Red, White and Blue. Symbol of all that they hold dear, this combination of colors inspires thoughts of pride and patriotism. The youth of America are particularly enthusiastic and any boy or girl would be proud to have a room with a lovely patriotic quilt as an outstanding feature. We have had so many requests for just this type of quilt that we are now offering our new design and hope that it will be exactly what is wanted.

DIRECTIONS

1. First make actual size patterns for all of the parts as numbered. To do this trace the outlines through thin paper and paste on cardboard on the smooth side of sandpaper, and cut out exactly along the penciled lines. Or transfer directly with carbon paper. Sandpaper patterns, placed rough side down on the goods, will not slip while marking. Mark the part number on each pattern. It is well to make several patterns for each part since there are so many pieces to be cut from each and one pattern may become worn.
2. If there is any doubt about the fastness of the colors, or a possibility of shrinkage, first wash and iron the materials. If the top is washed before quilting, also shrink the goods for the quilt back.
3. Now mark the required number of pieces on each color of cloth as listed on the Yardage Chart. Mark on the right side of the goods and space the outlines far enough apart to allow for seams (1/8" or less) when the pieces are cut. DO NOT CUT ALONG THESE LINES, which remain to show where to turn under the edges for basting. Sort the pieces according to color and baste them together so that they will not be lost but will be ready for use when needed.
4. The piecing must be done with great care, for the design as well as the smoothness of the finished quilt depends upon it. First piece together the five diamonds (Part 1) of the star. Press to insure neatness, and applique in the exact center of Part 2. Be sure that the stars are all pointed in the same direction.

5. Now join the red and white Parts 3 and 4 to Part 2 as shown in the diagram of the quilt. Part 5 may then be added to Part 4 on the right side and bottom of the parts already joined. Thirty of this combination of parts will be needed.
6. Next join Parts 6 through 14 as shown in the diagram. Twenty of these combinations will be required plus the half sections which complete the outside circles of the design.
7. You are now ready to combine all of the parts of the quilt. Add to the unit made of Parts 2, 3, 4 and 5 the units made of Part 6 through 14. Be very sure that the seams meet exactly to assure the continuity of the circles. The outer circles are completed with additional Parts 3, 4 and 5 as shown in the Diagram. When all of these Parts have been joined together, complete the quilt top with a 5" border of blue material.

QUILTING SUGGESTIONS

The final step in making a quilt is the quilting. This includes marking the quilting design on the top, fixing the quilt back to the frame, laying the Mountain Mist Quilting Cotton and the quilt top on the frame, stretching and fastening the entire quilt, and stitching the quilting design. We have given you our suggestions for the quilting of the 5" border perforated through this pattern. The many pieces of the main body of the quilt do not leave much room for any but regular quilting. We suggest that the circles be continued in quilting as shown in the Diagram of the Quilt. Each part should be quilted about 1/8" from the seam so that there will be a complete design on the back of your quilt which will be equally as beautiful as the top.
