Lois Has a Steak Fry  
For Fourth of July

When Roger and Lois were up in the Canadian woods they learned the fun of camping out. They also tasted the food which has a flavor all its own when cooked over a camp fire in an out of doors camp. They came back most enthusiastic regarding camping and out of door parties. They persuaded a group of their friends to go out with them over the Fourth of July. Lois said she would bring the coffee, cream, sugar, tomatoes, onions, crackers and sweet chocolate if the men would get the steaks and buns. Roger told her he had a dreadful time persuading the men that they could possibly eat as much as he told them to order.



They used a portable grill which they set over the camp fire. A camp coffee pot made the hot coffee. A frying pan with a long handle was used to cook the steak. This steak was cut into pieces large enough to go between a sliced bun. When the steak was done the buns were put into the frying pan cut side down, and sauted lightly. Then the salted and peppered steak, sliced onions and sliced raw tomatoes were put on top and the top half of the bun covered that. They were eaten from the fingers, in true out-of-door fashion.

Milk chocolate squaffles were put between two crackers which were held over the fire until the chocolate began to grow soft
