She had her choice of flowered dimity or striped broadcloth and chose the broadcloth. The firmness of it appealed to her, although she considered the sheer dimity for wear on the hottest days.

The brassiere has narrow shoulder straps. The shorts are made with fitted yoke. They can well be considered when wearing the new tuck-in blouses made like shirts. These blouses go with skirts with fitted yokes. The blouse and skirt meet at the normal waistline.



Another fortunate purchase was this good looking nightgown. This particular one is made of crepe de chine, although a sheer cotton material might well be used. The only trimming is a deep band of lace used as a yoke both back and front. Shoulder bows may be of ribbon or of the material of which the nightgown is made.

One of these in apricot ninon with ecru lace and bows of two-toned apricot and yellow ribbon is lovely.

Sometimes these gowns are bound around the bottom with a contrasting color. An all white with ecru lace and ecru binding is most effective.
