Steak Creole

Two and one-half pounds round steak, cut 2 inches thick, $\frac{1}{4}$ cup flour, $1\frac{1}{2}$ cups canned tomatoes, bacon fat, 6 onions, 1 green pepper, $1\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoons salt, $\frac{1}{4}$ teaspoon pepper.

Wipe the steak with a damp cloth, sprinkle with flour and pound with the edge of a heavy plate until the flour has all been pounded in. Turn to other side and repeat the process. Continue in this way until as much flour as possible has been pounded into the steak (it will probably take the $\frac{1}{4}$ cup). Sear the meat until well browned on both sides in hot bacon fat in a skillet. Add the tomatoes and enough boiling water to cover. Add the peeled onions, chopped green peppers and the seasonings. Simmer over a low fire for about 2 hours, or until tender, or bake in a moderate oven.

Fried Italian Squash

Pare the squash and cut into slices. Sprinkle with salt and pepper and dip in flour. Fry slowly in a small amount of butter until brown on both sides and tender.

Chocolate Spice Squares

One-fourth cup butter, 1 cup sugar, 2 eggs, $\frac{1}{2}$ cup boiling water, 2 squares unsweetened chocolate melted over hot water, $\frac{1}{4}$ teaspoon soda, $\frac{1}{2}$ cup sifted pastry flour, $1\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoons baking powder, $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon salt, $\frac{1}{4}$ cup sour milk, $\frac{1}{2}$ cup apple butter, 1 teaspoon vanilla, $\frac{1}{2}$ cup nut meats.

Cream the butter, add the sugar gradually and cream until light and
