LILY OF THE VALLEY IS SIXTEENTH GARDEN QUILT BLOCK



THIS is the sixteenth of a series of 21 blocks which are to be designed so that you may have an appliqued Flower Garden quilt with each block in a different pattern. There is nothing monotonous about working out this kind of a quilt, and to know that you will have something that is really different when finished makes it especially fascinating.

To make the top of this quilt you should have 36 blocks of white percale, muslin or broadcloth, each measuring 9x12 inches and four and one-third yards of material will be sufficient for this purpose.

You will require 20 of these blocks for the part which is on top of the bed, each block being different and 16 for the border, these all being the same design. And if these are all cut and stacked the making will seem easier because it may be done systematically.

You will also require two yards of plain gingham, percale, chambray or broadcloth. This is to be
