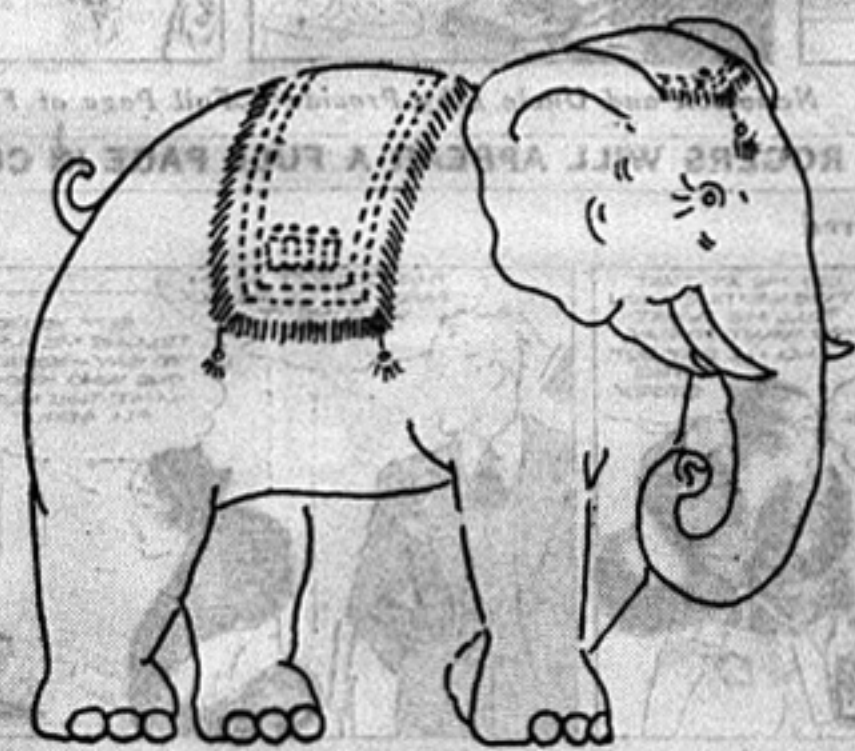


BEAUTY IN THE HOME.

There are giraffes, ducks, geese, whales (blowing gorgeous bubbles), just anything that one could possibly imagine that would interest a little boy or girl.

Of course these juvenile patterns constitute only a small portion of all the designs in The Detroit News Wonder Package for there are over 800 in all and each one may be used 12 or more times.

There are designs for the decorat-



ing of furniture, the embroidering of rugs, draperies, dresser scarfs, table runners, clothes—well, almost anything you could think of in the way of making your home or your clothes look their "Sunday-go-to-meeting best."
