where I got my Trip Around the
World pattern. Well, my father's
cousin spends the winter season in

brought the pattern to Detroit sev-

gave the pattern. My pieces are
smaller than the ones in the quilt
made by the "Corner" editor, and
my quilt has over 4,500 small blocks.

I have a great many patterns and
exchange them with a friend in
Louisville, Ky. I have sent her all
of the Horoscope patterns up to
date, as she is very much enthused
about them and can hardly wait for
the patterns to be issued each week.

As I am particularly interested,
