

WINDOWS are important, of course, from the standpoint of light and ventilation; but from the decorative standpoint also and must be treated very carefully in order that you may get the most out of your room in the way of charm.

Could anything be much more ideal than the room as shown if one wanted an attractive, livable, hospitable room—one that would make a house the gathering place, really a very flattering attitude on the part of one's friends.

Plain painted walls and woodwork in oyster white would be ideal for the background if colorful chintzes are to be used in the scheme, and for the floor covering large-sized Oriental rugs would be in keeping with a room as large as this. These may have deep rose backgrounds, showing shades of blue, green and gold in the design.

Glass curtains of a fine quality of white voile or marquisette finished with ruffles would give the windows just the degree of charm that is required; and for the overdraperies light green ground flowered chintz with deep rose predominating in the design would be effective. These should be very simply made, finished to reach to the floor and put up with a shirred valance of the same material. They may be lined, but are not incorrect if left unlined for the transparency of the pattern in this material in this kind of a room is very delightful.
