It seems quite imperative to manage grandmothers. Fairly good and misdeemeanors look small to them. They have lost their perspective in child care. If it seems wise to attempt to educate Grandmothers then she should be called in to make suggestions regarding the code.

IMPORTANT RULES.

The code should run something like this: (1) The baby's sleeping hours shall be from 6 p. m. to 6 a. m. and nothing shall be allowed to interfere with the regularity of its performance.

(2) The person whose responsibility it is to feed the child should be permitted to devise and carry out his own methods of guidance. It should be clearly stated in the code that no one is to offer even old suggestions during the meal or the presence of the child. Helpful points may be brought up later, considered and discussed in family conference.

(3) There shall be no fault-finding before the child regarding methods. Each member of the family should have a copy of the code and infringement may be noted and considered later.

(4) No attempt shall be made to influence one member of the family to express his criticism or disapproval of the methods of another.

(5) It is the privilege of the national parents to rear their own children according to their plans and wishes.

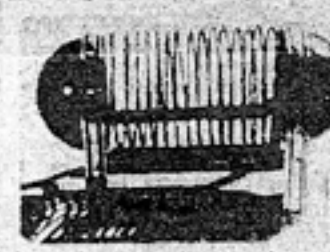
Anyone who has completed a quilt from any Detroit News pattern will be eligible to become a member and enter this contest.

The floor covering is in brown, parr cream and tomato red, these different tones being distributed about in small rectangles, parallel lines and dots.

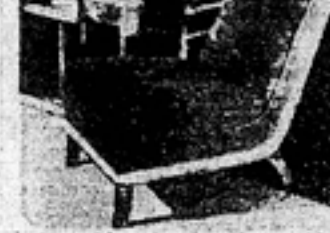
In one of the smaller illustrations is shown the giant's atride stairway, constructed of aluminum, shining silver and amazingly simple, striking
