- Spanish Eggs                      Flaky Rice

**T**HE meatless meal can be made  
 as interesting as the one with  
 meat especially if a little novelty  
 is added to the preparation of the  
 main dish as happens in this recipe  
 for eggs and pimientos.

*Spanish Eggs.*

Rub a shallow individual baking  
 dish (or use muffin tins), with oil  
 or butter; line each dish with a  
 canned pimiento (the seven ounce  
 can is enough for six servings) and  
 make sure that the peppers cover  
 the inner surface of dish. Break  
 one egg into each pimiento cup, and  
 then sprinkle with salt. Set dishes  
 on a shallow pan and bake in a  
 moderate oven, 375 degrees F. for  
 15 minutes, or until the eggs are  
 firm but tender. Serve right in the  
 baking dishes or if muffin dishes  
 are used slip the baked egg and  
 pimiento onto buttered toast.

*Apple Zwieback.*

One-half cup finely crumbled  
 zwieback, ¼ cup milk, 2 eggs  
 beaten, ½ cup sugar, 1 teaspoon
