

In making the gentian at the top, there are 18 petals cut of the shape and size as the one marked "11." The varying sizes are obtained by placing one petal on top of an-other, overlapping some much more than others.

This flower is "tricky" to make, Forget-me-not No. 8 is pink, and but beautiful when the colors are graded and the small pieces neatly
