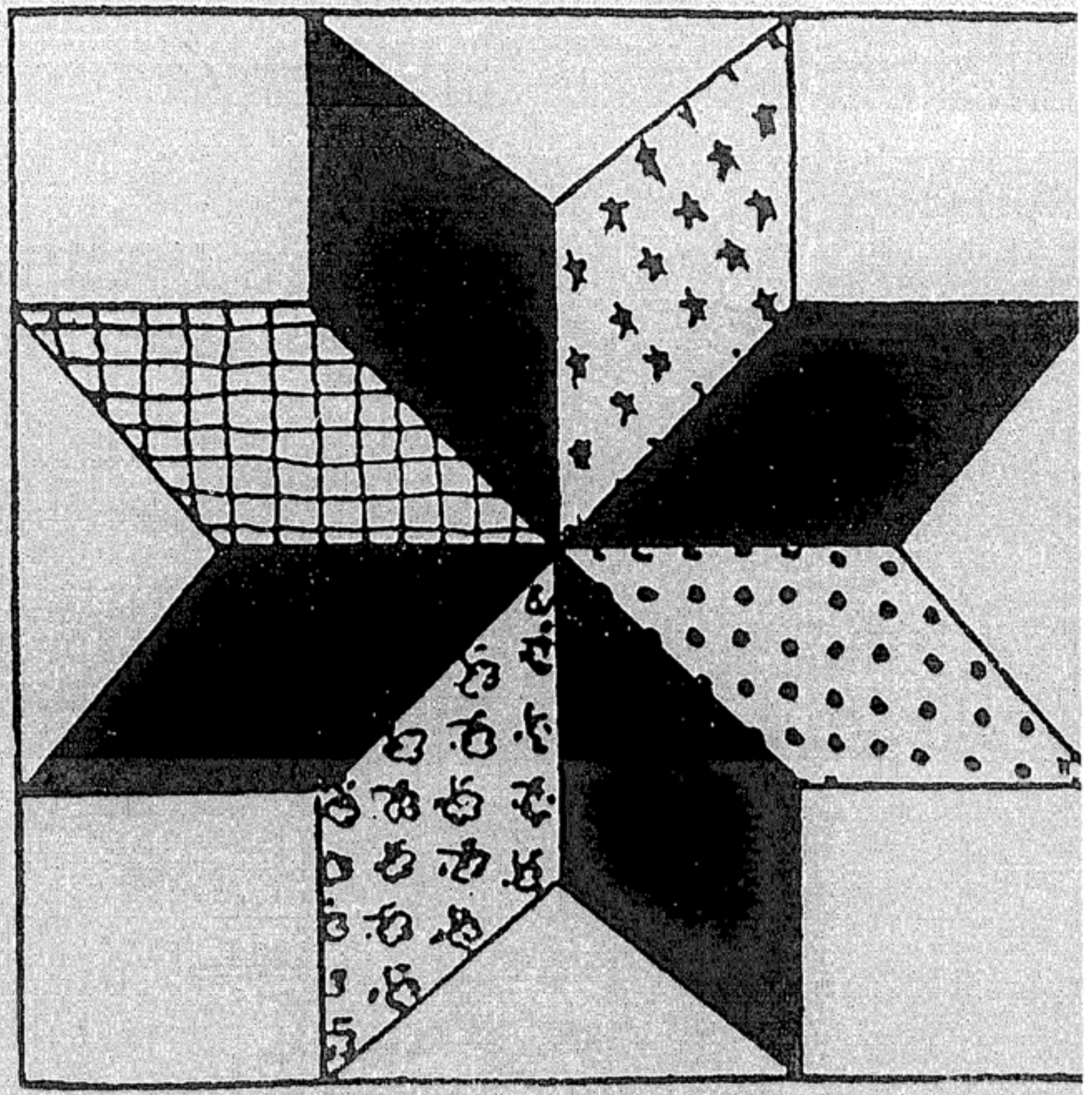

THE DOUBLE MONKEY WRENCH is another of those quaint, old-time patterns for quilt making that our grandmothers used so effectively. "Churn Dash" is another name for this design. There are many ways of working it out but if you have a basket of bits from other quilts, this is an excellent way to utilize them.
