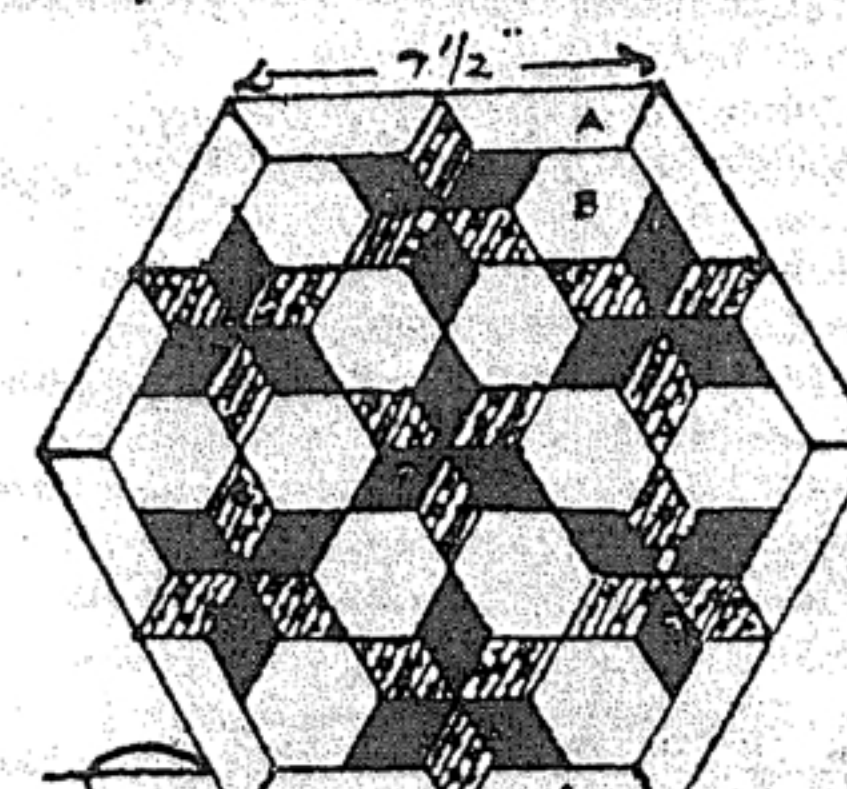

If your skin is inclined to roughen by little, dry goose pimples or if it is oily, coarse, studded with blackheads, start determined effort now to correct

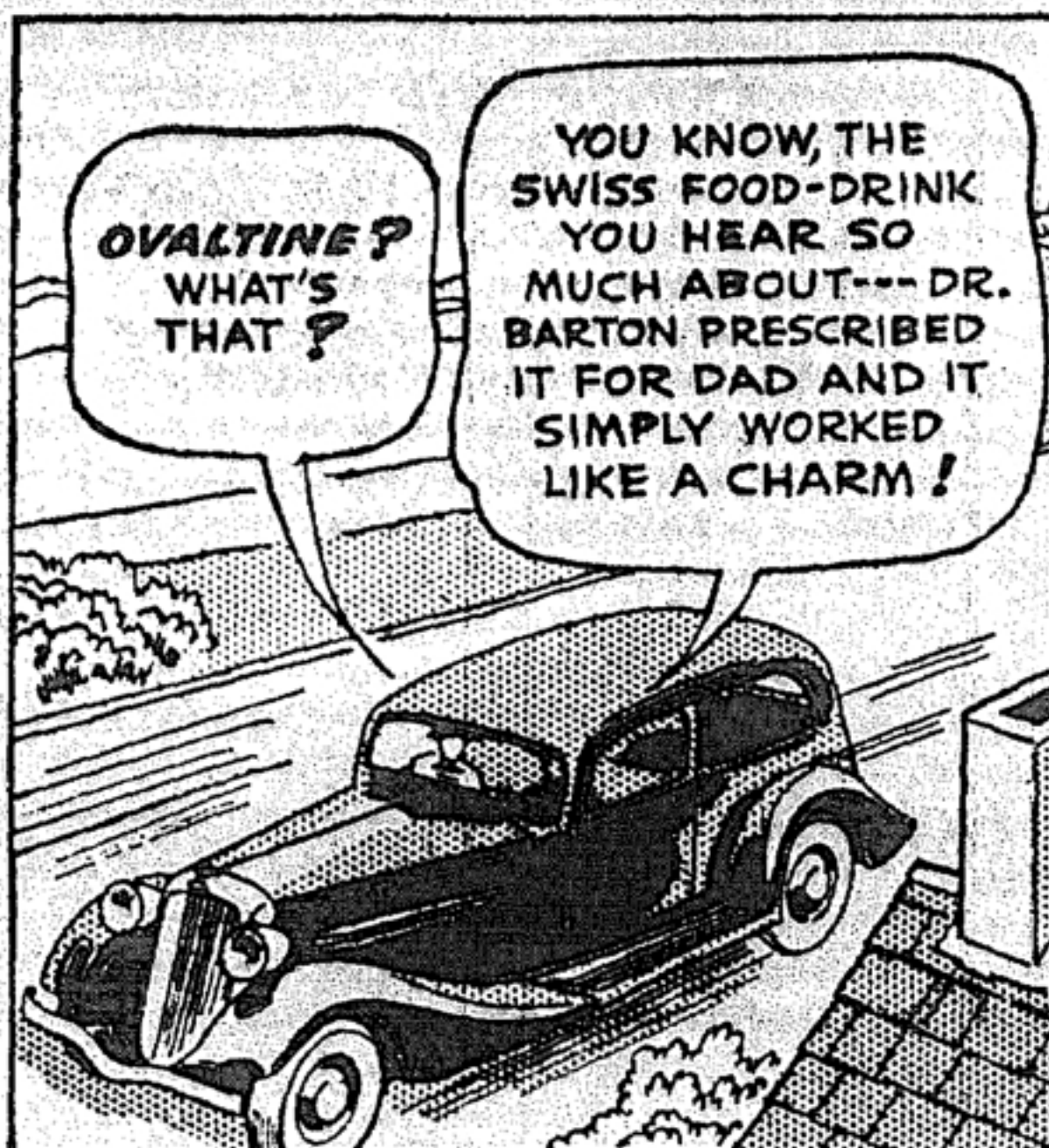
