
## California Visitor Makes Quilt

SHE just happened to find a piece of percale that half a little white-rig-rag pattern in it that looked like rick-rack braid and this was used for the top and bottom edges of the drums. The collars on the Scotties are of material with little white discs having black polka dot centers and look just as if buttons had been sewed on a strip. This same material is used for the foundation of the trees. the trees

Mrs. Kerb had to look hard and long before she found just the right material for the waves on which the boats are riding so merrily and she said that the most difficult part of the whole quilt was getting the horses manes just right. They were made of such narrow pieces and wavy, at that, that they were any-thing but easy to put on and they, look so simple when finished.
