are Scotties in percale and gingham appliqued patches. No two Scotties are alike.

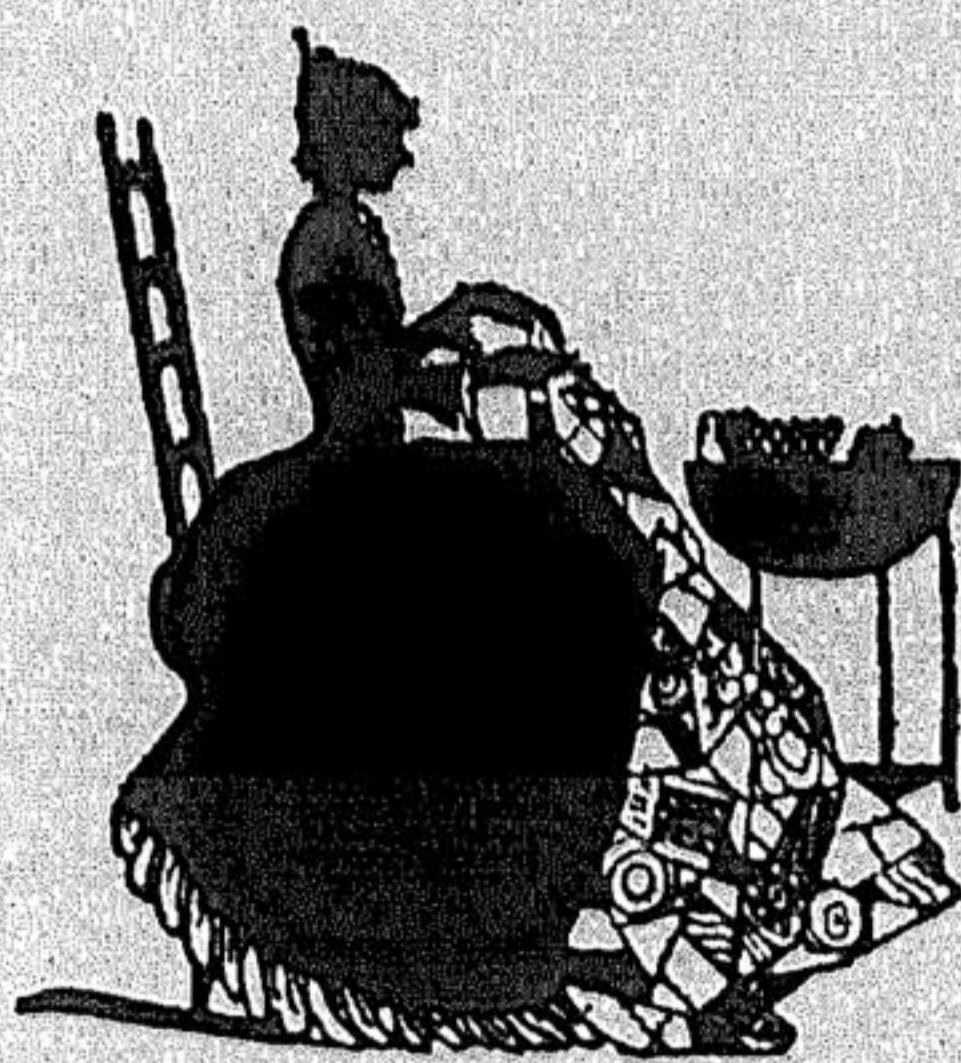
The border, back and binding are also green to match the kitten blocks. A running stitch in black outlines all of the blocks and forms a fence around the edge of the quilt.
