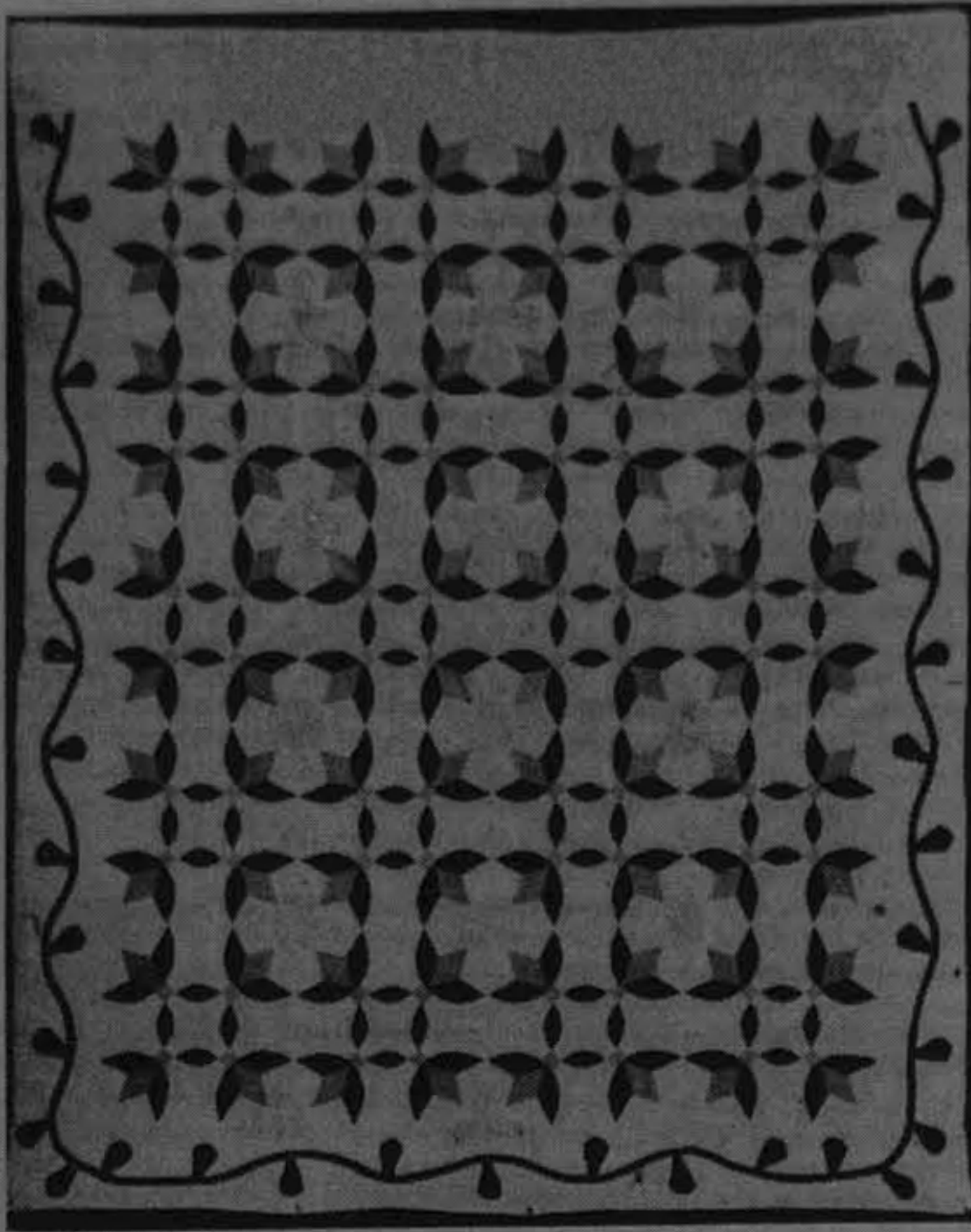


Quilt Is Discovered Heirloom

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have been carefully cut and with the exception of a small part of the vine border (which is appliqued while the rest of the quilt is pieced) every bit is done by hand. However, there is a small amount of machine stitching on the border. To have a machine in 1872 (when the quilt was made) was really something to be proud of, and there is no better proof of this than that this time of sewing was used on the most prized possessions—quilts.

So seriously did Tinnie Ford take her name that even all of her coin silver was marked "Tinnie."

THIS quilt was made in a little settlement called Teaspoon Corner near Leslie, Ingham County, Michigan and with this interesting background, no wonder Mrs. Grant is anxious to preserve it and display it to the best advantage.
