There will be three prizes for applied quilts, as follows (these must be completed quilts): First \$50.00 Second 25.00 Third 10.00

There will be three prizes for pieced (completed) quilts, as follows: First \$50.00 Second 25.00 Third 10.00

And there will also be three prizes for tops only, in applied design, as follows: First \$25.00 Second 20.00 Third 10.00

For quilt tops which are of piecework designs there are to be three prizes: First \$35.00 Second 20.00 Third 10.00

And for the children's and young girls' quilts there will be two prizes, as follows: First \$15.00 Second 10.00

There will be ribbon awards for the antique quilts and coverlets.
