WINNIPEG, Man.—You've probably heard of crows that talk. Well, Mrs. Ed Ward of Delta, Man., on southern Lake Manitoba, has a three-year-old canary that not only can out-warble any other bird, but its notes and chirps have a musical meaning.

Answering to the name of "Rollic," this unusual bird, purchased at Portage, has astounded neighbors at the Delta by singing the first seven notes of "Ave Maria." The canary is said to have picked up the tune by itself, and often sings it several times a day. The Wards live at the Delta Experimental station.
