THE QUICK QUILTMAKING HANDBOOK

Those quiltmakers who have heretofore been less than enthusiastic about machine quiltmaking methods are in for a very pleasant surprise. They will be delightfully impressed with the speed and accuracy of their first project using this book as a quide.

Without a doubt, Ms. Johannah has devoted a great deal of time and effort in preparing and writing this book. She has given much thought to the novice in these methods as well as the experience quiltmaker. She offers a true wealth of step by step illustrations and very detailed instructions for quick quiltmaking.

Being a long time advocate of quick machine piecing techniques it is indeed gratifying to see them in easy to follow book form.

I must admit I don't agree with Barbara's reasons for 1/2" seam allowances but for those, like me, who prefer 1/4" seam allowances, it is an easy matter to substitute this measurement in your initial planning. Ripping fabric into strips has always been sore spot with me - I prefer the accuracy of speed cutting many thicknesses of fabric with good, sharp scissors.

If you want your quiltmaking to be faster, more efficient and more accurate this reasonably priced handbook is the perfect tool for you.

at diagram F, and when properly placed will look as in diagram G. When the sections are all joined, the rays are put in with lines of floss, which be of contrasting color as shown in diagram G. When enough oblongs for the quilts are completed they are joined together. Sometimes several colors will be introduced in an oblong and the arrangements of colors and materials will be different in several sets of oblongs."

The quilt belonging to Mr. and Mrs. Olson is pieced of black and tan rayon and lined with a very bold red and black cotton print in large scale.
