## A QUILTER'S ALBUM OF BLOCKS & PATTERNS

by Jinny Beyer. Published by EPM Publications Inc. 1003 Turkey Run Rd, McLean, CA 22101. 208 pgs, \$16.95 hardbound.

For years I have listened to Jinny Beyer tell her classes about combining prints in quilts, but I come from a generation that was repeatedly told, "Don't mix prints". I have tried unsuccessfully, but it wasn't until I read this book and studied the marvelous illustrations that I really understood what Jinny was doing.

The illustrations and the chapter on "Use of Fabrics" was well worth the price of the book. In addition the history buff gets a good chapter entitled "Sources for Quilt Patterns" which is about Jinny's search through GODEY'S LADY'S BOOK and PETERSON'S for early patterns. She discovered that early GODEY'S did not have patterns in them, despite what we have been told. Her choice of excerpts from the early magazines was delightful.

In Jinny's first book, PATCHWORK PATTERNS, she set forth her theories on basic categories used in geometric designs. In this companion volume she has categorized patterns for easy identification and

With a book that I will refer to as often as this one, I am sure I will appreciate the hard cover.

I was impressed with her coverage of border designs. There is so much interest in Medallion quilts and their elaborate borders; this book takes you far beyond the simple traditional borders and opens up a whole new world.
