The original was on display in the Sears, Roebuck Building all during A Century of Progress Exposition. Miss Margaret Rogers Caden, its maker, was awarded the Grand National Prize of \$1000.00 and \$250.00 in regional prizes.

This original prize winning quilt was made entirely from Sears Fast Color Cottons in two shades of green combined with a green and yellow print. Border is a plain green to match the star. The beautiful feathered design is made with cotton padding, outlined with hundreds of tiny stitches.

In the 1974 THE DENVER ART MUSEUM QUILTS AND COVERLETS by Imelda DeGraw describes Mrs. Whitehill's quilt, "In the center, where there are approximately 115 leaves, there is no duplication of calicoes. The four inch strip around the center section has repeat, padded leaf forms. The sawtooth edge was made by overlapping triangles of different colored materials." 
AUTUMN LEAVES


From SEARS CENTURY OF PROGRESS IN QUILTMAKING, Sears Roebuck and Co @ 1934

...you can almost hear them rustle

"Meaning this popular 'Autumn Leaves' applique quilt of course; well done, it seemed a sure-fire prize winning entry in the National Quilting Contest. Several of them carried away fine prizes. Formerly this appealing pattern was called 'Thousand Leaves' probably because about a thousand pieces as outlined below went into the design. Or, in working them out, they may have only seemed like a thousand! If you have ever seen the exquisite colorful effect of a finished original, you never guessed they were so easy to make.

"'Autumn Leaves'...is a 'Top Quilt' or a 'Lapful' as our grandmothers were wont to call it. In making, sew the top together, then measure top and applique the design..."





Mat'ls req'd: 7 yds white, 3 yds ass't prints, 3 bolts green bias tape for stems. The design can be varied by adding a 2" strip of green between the quilt and the border. Bind outer edge of quilt with green quilt binding. Allow for seams
