AFTER THE FACT: The Art of Historical Detection by James West Davidson and Mark Hamilton Lytle. Knopf. 1982. Hardcover. \$19.50; softcover, \$12.50. by Dixie Haywood

Many of us addicted to reading history are somewhat fuzzy about how historians arrive at the "facts" we read. This fascinating book explains whe ways historians do their detective work. The authors do this in an interesting manner, using American historical events from pre-revolutionary days to the present to illustrate the problems historians face.

Each chapter focuses on a different aspect of research methods, including selection of material, community records, photographic analysis, oral history, psychohistory, documentation and the varying interpretations possible from the same evidence. The chapter is followed by sources for those who wish to investigate the subject further with original sources. This information gives potential clues to would-be researchers interested in trying their hand at historical sleuthing.

The chance to look over the shoulders of historians at work is compelling. AFTER THE FACT gives an appreciation of the complexity and excitement that the authors feel for the study of the past, and may encourage some of us to search out overlooked material in our field.

The book is also available in a two volume edition from Quality Paperback Book Club for \$7.95.


