## MODERNISTIC STAR UPDATE


Cuesta Benberry (see pg 7) wrote to give us further information about the "Modernistic Star" pattern which was featured in JOURNAL #23 on pg 17.

"Aunt Martha's Studios held a quilt contest and "Modernistic Star" was a winner. The pattern was published after that.

"The Modern Woodsman (address listed on the coupon at the bottom of pg 17 #23) was an insurance organization with headquarters in Rock Island, Ill. The lodge published its own magazine which had quilt pages in it. Sometimes the "quilt offerings" were from Aunt Martha's Studio; other times they came from Home Art Studio, Des Moines, 10. The MODERN WOODSMAN sold quilt booklets such as this PRIZE WINNING DESIGNS as well as individual quilt patterns by mail order.

"Aunt Martha's patterns were syndicated which is why they were available in so many places.

"Incidentally, Edna Ford conducted a <u>massive</u> study of Aunt Martha's Studio and she dated PRIZE WINNING DESIGNS Booklet at 1931 although the booklet is not dated."



Dr Jeannette Dean Throckmorton made this quilt in peach, green and yellow. She used cording for the inscription, "1943, Jeannette Anne Cropenhoft.
